Outcome 3: Innovative methods in teaching Physics / Science	
Relevant subject, skill or competence:	The formal subject is Physics. Observing innovative methods in this subject and sharing of professional knowledge, using IT tools in class. The participant will develop digital competence, personal, social and learning to learn competence.
Description:	The participant will observe teaching Physics/Science in class in different age groups. Discussing the methods used in class by a hosting teacher. Using new methods in class and sharing them with other teachers. Planning, implementation, report and reflection on experience.

Outcome 4: Language	competence
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Relevant subject, skill or competence:	Language and multilingual competence, personal, social and learning to learn competence; cultural awareness and expression competence.
Description:	By using English as a main language of communication will help the participant to develop her language skills in order to implement a CLIL method in class.

Outcome 5: European dimension and multicultural approach

Activity / task 3: Observing Physics/Science lessons	
Description:	The participant will attend Physics / Science lessons in different age groups, observe new methods used in teaching the subject (IT tools and applications), discuss and analyse the outcome of the lesson with a hosting teacher.

Activity / task 4: Using English as a language of communication	
Description:	The participant will communicate with a hosting partner, discuss and analyse lessons which will develop her language competence in English in order to interact with confidence in class and in everyday situations.

Activity / task 5: Multiculturalism	
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Description:	The participant will learn about places of historical, geographical, and environmental significance within the Danish heritage and a way of life and use this as inspiration for creating learning content though context.
